

Class Descriptions

Turnout, Reinsmanship, Working Pleasure—In each of the "arena" or "rail" classes, the horse and driver work both directions of the arena at a walk, slow trot, working trot, and strong trot, and are required to rein back. ADSRulebook, Chapter 4, Article 217-222.

Turnout is judged primarily on the overall impression of horse and driver: condition, fit and appropriateness of harness and vehicle, neatness and appropriateness of attire. **Reinsmanship** is judged primarily on the skill and ability of the driver. **WorkingPleasure** is judged primarily on the suitability of the horse to provide a pleasant drive.

Pick Your Route—After passing the starting line, the driver proceeds through each obstacle to the designated finish line, choosing his or her own route. Each obstacle is negotiated once and only once, but may be approached from either direction. Course faults are scored as penalty seconds and are added to the driver's elapsed time. Placings are determined on a low total time basis. For additional information, see the ADS Rulebook, Chapter 17, Article 248.

Gamblers Choice—Driven over a course of unnumbered obstacles, each with a specific point value. Each driver has the same amount of time to negotiate as many obstacles as possible. Each obstacle can be driven twice but not in succession. No obstacle can be re-driven once it has been disturbed unless it is meant to be knocked down. A signal will sound at the end of the time and the driver must then exit through the finish markers. If the signal sounds when the driver is committed to an obstacle, the competitor may complete the obstacle and then proceed to the finish marker for total time to be recorded. ADS Rulebook Chapter 17, Article 249.

CarriageDog—Judged primarily on suitability of the dog to serve as a companion (maximum one dog per vehicle). To be judged both ways in the arena at a walk, slow trot and working trot. a. The dog should be standing, lying down or seated on the vehicle. b. The dog must be under control at all times. c. The dog must not be led on the ground from the vehicle or be restrained by being tied to the vehicle, driver or passenger. d. The driver should not hold the dog, and the dog should not interfere with the driver in any way. 231.2 The dog may be of any breed. 231.3 To be judged • 60% on the suitability of the dog to serve as a companion. • 30% on the performance, manners and way of going of the horse(s) • 10% on the overall impression of the turnout, including the dog. • Entries with a dog clearly not under control may be eliminated. ADS Rulebook, Chapter 6, Article 231

Timed Obstacles—Driven over course consisting of up to 20 paired cones. After crossing the starting line, the driver proceeds through the cones in numerical order to the finish line. For additional information, see the ADS Rulebook, Chapter 7, Article 247.

CrossCountry Pace: To be driven at a prescribed pace (Horse—14kph; Large Pony 12 kph; Small Pony 11 kph and VSE 9 kph). Course will be approximately 2-3 km in length and will go through wooded areas, over a bridge and on some concrete road areas and numbered gates. Placings are determined on a low course fault basis and then the horse closest to the ideal pace time if the drivers are tied with equal number of faults. Faults include disobedience of horse to go through an obstacle or gate. A map of the country pace course will be available at check-in along with a more detailed list of course penalties. House Rules will be handed out at drivers meeting.

Training level CT: Will consist of Dressage and Cones: Open to a horse that has not completed more than one recognized Combined Driving Event (CDE) or Driving Trial (DT) above the Training division, driven by a driver of any level of competitive experience, or open to a driver who has not completed more than one recognized CDE or DT above the Training division, with a horse of any level of competitive experience. The purpose of training tests is to establish that the correct foundation is being laid for the training of the driving horse requiring the horse to move freely forward in a free walk on long rein and the working trot, in rhythm while accepting the bit with relaxation, through transitions and 40m circles. Cones will follow immediately after an individual dressage test and is designed to test the fitness, obedience and suppleness of the horses and the skill and competence of the Athletes. Training level B, 80m will be used for the dressage test.

Divisions offered at the Pioneer Pleasure Driving Show See ADS Rules para 2.7 and Appendix GR-B:

- I. Large Pony, equines (120cm to 148cm; with or without shoes; 149cm with shoes)
- II. Open Horse, (equines over 148cm without shoes or 149cm with shoes);
- III. Youth, JR. Driver, a driver who is 18 years of age throughout this year. See Chapter 3, Article 2(7) of the ADS Rulebook. All Jr Drivers must wear must wear properly fitted and fastened protective headgear that meets or exceeds current ASTM/SEI standards. Drivers under 14 must be accompanied by a knowledgeable adult if driving a pony or horse; if driving a VSE, must be 12 to Drive alone
- IV. VSE (less than 99cm with or without shoes) and Small Pony (99cm to less than 120cm; with or without shoes)
- V Drivers with Special Needs (physical, intellectural or medical)
- VI Multiples, any hitch with more than 1 horse to include pairs, tandems and teams
- VII Novice, open to any horse or driver who has not won 3 first place ribbons at ADS shows

Please note that divisions may be combined or split at the discretion of show management.

Marathon/Utility style vehicles acceptable in each division; wire spoke wheels acceptable in VSE/Small pony, Youth and Special Needs Divisions

DrivingDirections:I-80 to exit 379, go North on Hwy 15 for 6 miles to Hwy 34 intersection, Turn left (west) for approximately 1 mile, watch for Seward County Fairgrounds sign on North side of road and go 1/2 mile North. Show will be in NE corner of fairgrounds.

Health Requirements: Health Certificate/Coggins required on all Out of State Horses. Vaccination against WNV, WEE/EEE, flu/rhino required by proof of purchase or veterinary documentation within previous 6 months.

CancellationPolicy-No weather cancellations. Full refund available for competitor or horse medical issue (Physician/veterinary documentation required).



I AGREE to release, indemnify and hold harmless Eastern Nebraska Driving Society their officers, directors, instructors and volunteers from and against any and all loss, liability or damage arising from , because of or in connection to my participation in this competition.

American Driving Society DISCLAIMER and HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT: This form must be signed by every Competition participant or if a minor, their consenting parent, including each person who rides with a driver on a carriage not only during the actual Competition but including any time from arrival at the Competition to departure. I understand and agree that neither the American Driving Society ("ADS") and its officers, the Driving Event Competition ("Competition"), Competition judges, officials, workers, volunteers or organizing committee nor the property owners accept or shall have any responsibility of any nature whatsoever for accidents, damage, injury or illness to the horses, owners, riders, drivers, grooms, passengers, attendants, spectators or any other person or property in connection with this Competition.
